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Hannah Caldwell Elementary School (In-Class, Replacement)

1) The students IEPs will be reflective of the program placements. Their goals and objectives will be addressed in a less restrictive environment with proper supports and related services by providing in-class replacement/support programs in Hannah Caldwell Elementary School. Therefore, there are no unmet student needs.

- a. The class will have a maximum of eight classified students. The age range is as follows: 1 section of students 10-11 years of age for single subject content area per period which includes Language Arts, Reading, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies.

- c. Establishment of this class allows students to remain in programs that are least restrictive in district.
