#### **Code of Conduct Addendum**

#### **Union High School Extended Day Program**

Union High School's Extended Day Program is designed to provide students who have committed serious infraction as outlined within the Code of Conduct and Student Handbook with the opportunity to attend class beyond the scope of the regularly scheduled school day. Students who are enrolled in the program receive instruction within the core subject areas in order to ensure all instructional requirements are met. Students receive instruction by highly qualified teachers within each core area.

#### Program Criteria

In order to be entered into the Extended Day Program (EDP) a student must have committed a serious infraction against the District Code of Conduct and Student Handbook Regulations as listed and provided to students annually. Students who are assigned to the EDP program are required to attend the program and engage in instruction on a daily bases.

Students who are enrolled in the program for a number of disciplinary infractions are monitored by a program administrator, guidance counselor and various teachers for the length of stay in the program.

### Extended Day Program

#### Philosophy:

The Extended Day Program offers students the chance to stay on track academically in a highly structured environment where establishing and maintaining discipline is a priority.

#### **Mission Statement:**

The mission of the Extended Day Program is to empower students with the skills to achieve success in post secondary life. This includes the development of a school environment that sets rigorous standards for achievement, stresses student accountability, and students social needs as our core belief.

#### **Program Objectives and Goals:**

- Create a successful learning environment for students not achieving in the regular school setting.
- Provide structured support to students in areas such as: time management,
   appropriate school/ work behaviors, etc.
- Create clear, obtainable expectations for students that allow them to learn and succeed.
- Hold students accountable for their academic and behavioral performance in order to achieve a high school diploma.
- Increase the level of family involvement.
- Create effective lines of communication between parents and EDP staff so that the family is aware of the expectations placed on the student.
- Include family activities as part of the EDP setting.
- Provide students with life-skills training.
- Provide students with the skills to succeed in the work force.
- Help students develop skills that allow them to cope with diverse situations.
- Educate students in substance abuse issues.
- Provide students with experiences that allow them to become more aware with their community and surroundings.

#### **Student Expectations**

As an EDP student you are expected to do the right thing in every situation and you are encouraged to actively protect the rights of others. This will require you to think before you act and be aware of what is going on around you.

**Expectations:** All students are expected to:

Treat others the way you would like to be treated.

Be sensitive to other's feelings.

Refrain from physically hurting each other.

Use appropriate and respectful language. (If in doubt don't say it.)

Be on time to school and prepared to learn. (Guidelines below)

Listen to and respond appropriately to the adults and others at school.

Respect yourself, others and school property.

Be safe.

**Dress Code**: All students will be required to comply with the student dress code. Guidelines can be found in the handbook under Student Grooming and Dress. Please remember that school is a place of learning. We ask that students present themselves in a manner that is non-distracting. This includes clothing, accessories and personal appearance.

**No regular school activities**: students are unable to attend dances, assemblies, and other specified events, unless otherwise approved by the building Principal.

No Visitors: absolutely no visitors are allowed to the EDP.

**No Electronic Devices**: Students must store all electronic devices in their assigned EDP locker at the beginning of the day.

**Attendance**: Students are expected to be in attendance on a daily basis. If there is a need for a student to be absent or tardy a parent/guardian must contact the main office, 851-6858 or 851-6512, prior to 2:45 p.m. on the day of record. If an emergency arises, contact the main office or EDP phone numbers listed above.

\*Failure to follow the Student Expectations may result in an extension of time in the program, loss of credit or both.
