Dear Kimberly,

We appreciate the opportunity to outline the home and hospital educational services offered by Education, Inc. We have been providing educational services since 1995 and serve many school systems and hospitals in Connecticut, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New York, New Jersey, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and Washington, DC. How we are paid? Education, Inc. performs our work under an agreement with each school district for home and hospital teaching. Our staff submits paperwork needed under the school system's requirements for classroom presence. Since we must pay our teachers whether or not a student shows up for an appointment, we require at least a 24-hour notification to reschedule a session. We pay each teacher directly and there is no minimum hour requirement per student. For each hour spent with the student in the classroom, we also bill the district 20 minutes for preparation and administrative time. Students receive the same number of classroom hours they would receive from their home district's Teacher's, but are taught by our teachers who also work with the facility's therapeutic staff to maximize your child's rapid return to health.

As you can see, the benefits of using our hospital and home Teaching program are:

- · Highly qualified teachers presenting subjects in which they are skilled.
- · Better communication among all parties,
- · A close connection between educational and therapeutic staff, and
