Summary of Plot: A young man who survives a disaster at sea is hurtled into an epic journey of adventure and discovery. While cast away, he forms an unexpected connection with another survivor: a fearsome Bengal tiger.

Rationale for Usage: In this unit students are exploring the analysis of the essential question, "What does it take to survive?" where they explore literature that deals with the topic of survival. The students are also reading an excerpt from the novel *Life of Pi* in their textbooks and both the movie and book deal heavily with the topic of survival. The story depicts how an Indian man is able to survive after the ship he is on is wrecked, and all of his family is killed. He is left many months at sea with just himself, and a tiger.
