





JROTC HISTORY IS MADE

The Union High School Army ROTC Drill Team has captured its second consecutive national championship at the 2025 All Services National High School Drill Team Championship in Daytona Beach, Florida. Competing against over one hundred elite teams from the Army, Navy, Marines, and Air Force, our cadets took home the Division 2 Armed Championship and placed second in the Unarmed Championship-defeating top programs including the USMC National Champions from Reading, PA and the US Army National Champions from Mansfield, TX. This marks the first time in school history Union JROTC has won back-to-back national titles, building on their 2024 Division 3 win-and adding to an already legendary legacy of three national championships (2014, 2024, 2025) and 24 straight state titles. Accredited as an Honor Unit with Distinction, Union's JROTC ranks in the top 10% of over 1500 programs nationwide.

"Our kids continue to raise the bar, said 1SG (Ret.) Gerald Schemel, Drill Coach. "Wining it all again after moving up to Division 2 shows just how determined they were." From proud seniors like C/LTC Genesis Munoz, who reflected on four years of excellence, to freshmen like C/CPL Amirah Ali, who founded confidence and community in JROTC-this championship is more than a title. It's a testament to discipline, teamwork, and resilience.
