

HOW TO PROPOSE A NEW CLUB OR ACTIVITY

Any student or staff member that hopes to add a new club, activity or organization to the Co-Curricular program should follow the steps listed below. All proposals and accompanying petitions must be submitted after the first day of school but prior to March 1 to be considered. If you have any questions, please contact the administrator in charge of Student Activities, Mr. Rettino via email at vrettino@twpunionschools.org.

<u>Step One</u>: The person proposing the club or activity must fill out the Proposal Outline for Club/Organization. Please fill out the information to the best of your knowledge with as much detail as possible. Feel free to attach any supporting documents that support your proposal.

Step Two: The administrator in charge of Student Activities will send all of the information included in your proposal, to the Superintendent's office. Mr. Tatum will share this information with the Stipend Committee at their next meeting. This committee – comprised of teachers, UTEA representatives, administrators, and a member of the Board of Education – will decide whether to recommend the proposal to the Board of Education's Human Resource Committee, to return the proposal with suggestions, or to reject the proposal. The administrator in charge of Student Activities will communicate the Stipend Committee's decision to the proposer(s).

Step Three: Any club or activity that is recommended by the Stipend Committee to the Board of Education's Human Resources Committee will be considered and voted on at their next available meeting, assuming the agenda allows time.

<u>Step Four</u>: Once a club or activity is approved by the Board of Education, the newly created sponsor position(s) will be advertised to the entire staff. Interested candidates should contact the Human Resources Department at this time. After the position has been advertised for two weeks, the interview process will begin.

Step Five: After a sponsor is hired, the club or activity is officially part of the Co-Curricular program. At this time, the new sponsor should meet with the administrator in charge of Student Activities for an orientation. Upon completion of the orientation, the club or activity can begin to meet regularly.

<u>Step Six</u>: Once a club or activity is approved by the Board of Education, the advisor and student(s) will be notified and provided a Charter Certificate by the administrator in charge of Student Activities.

Please note that any club, activity or organization to the Co-Curricular program should follow these steps for approval. If there is not a stipend involved, the only difference will be that the Stipend Committee will not meet to discuss or vote on the stipend amount. The club, activity or organization will still need to undergo the approval process with the Superintendent.
