Guida Faria asked the following questions: What is the number of students per building? What is the problem if we do nothing? Does every student in this town experience the same? Jefferson had no connection during that year; less transition improves SEL.

David Arminio asked preschool – would that impact transportation; would it benefit to add to elementary buildings to keep PreK in the building?

Susan Lipstein stated she would like to see change. Please try and find the data that has already been collected. We have been trying to make a change for almost ten years.

Kristen Nunes stated she is pro Jefferson and feels we are in a great place. We need many meetings to make this happen and it would not have happened if the other people had not wanted to do it.
