Re: Bid Evaluation for K-5 Professional Development

Our students have shown an improvement in state mandated examinations this past school year, however, as a district we want to continue to seek the help of outside consultants to facilitate the following:

Implement formative assessments for Grades K-5

Formative assessment is a self-reflective process that intends to promote student attainment. A process between teacher and student to enhance, recognize and respond to the learning. The goal of formative assessment is to gain an understanding of what students know (and don't know) in order to make responsive changes in teaching and learning.

We have chosen to use outside consultants to reach the above goals and objectives because, while district teachers/supervisors are qualified to carry this objective out; they have limited knowledge to carry out these objectives.

The Township of Union received \$831,811 in the FY12 Title I allocation. According to the NJDOE Title I guidelines, a designated Title I building needs to spend a portion of their allocation on professional development. Hannah Caldwell School received \$86, 268 Title I funds for the 2011-12 school year. Hannah Caldwell will continue with the Formative Assessment training the Title I staff attended during the 2010-11 school year. The professional development maximum reserve allocation for the 2011-12 school year to be spent will be \$12, 356.

Background:

IDE Corp. consultants provided professional development services to a group of representative teachers from across the elementary schools during the 2010-2011 school year. The focus was on improving student performance through formative assessment. These teachers then acted as turnkey trainers to share strategies and structures with their peers.

Our Views on the Common Core State Standards:

The new Common Core State Standards require teachers to think differently about teaching and learning. The standards move beyond the "facts" and memorization of concepts. Consider 4th grade language arts:

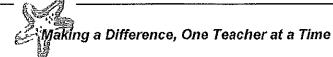
 Write opinion pieces on topics or texts, supporting a point of view with reasons and information.

Whereas typical curricular standards begin with lower order skills and build to a performance, which may or may not ever be addressed, the new standards begin with a performance that requires students to learn lower-order skills. The new standards focus more on cognitive processes. This level of writing cannot be mastered in a test-prep session a month before the test; it's a way of thinking about writing. This requires an instructional environment that engages students not only in regular writing experiences, but also builds a passion about topics on which to write. This is best accomplished through a problem-based, differentiated approach. It requires "minds-on" instruction that moves the teacher out of the front of the room and into the role of architect and facilitator. Continual formative assessment allows the teacher to monitor student progress toward a goal and modify instructional opportunities to ensure success.

Our Views on Formative Assessment:

Teachers tend to see themselves as presenters of knowledge with the students being responsible for paying attention, participating, and learning. When students do not succeed, they acknowledge the students and/or the students' circumstances as the root cause.

We use the metaphor of GPS (Global Positioning Systems) to focus on the importance of using assessment to drive instruction. Using GPS, you enter your destination; that is akin to the curricular standard. A satellite signal identifies where you are starting; that is the role of preassessment. The GPS lays out a path for you to follow; the teacher devises an instructional path. Throughout your trip, the GPS sends out a satellite signal to track your progress, modifying the path where necessary; a masterful teacher uses continual formative assessment to track student



progress and revises the instructional plan as needed. Teachers need to shift their paradigms to embrace that of "Teacher as GPS."

We categorize formative assessments as follows:

Temperature Gauges - Immediate, in-the-moment assessments that allow the teacher to get a sense of current student status. This often takes place while the teacher is presenting a lesson.

Based on student response, the teacher can adjust the lesson content and pacing, and identify any urgent student needs.

Examples: Adjective Check-In, 3 Finger Check-In

Breakpoints – Brief assessments given at a stopping point in instruction (such as the end of the class period or lesson), allowing the teacher to step back and revise the instructional plan.

Based on student response, the teacher can plan instructional activities and whole-class lessons.

Examples: Exit Cards, One Sentence Summary, Do Now, Higher-Order Questioning, Quizzes

Student Directed Assessments – Self-evaluative student reflection, giving the teacher insight into perceived needs.

Based on student response, the teacher can direct the student to appropriate resources – small-group or one-on-one instruction, websites, learning activities, and how-to sheets.

Examples: Checklists, Self-Assessment on a Rubric, Peer Evaluation, Student Journals

Comprehensive Assessments – Systematic data collection on individual skill & concept attainment.

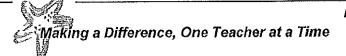
Based on student response, the teacher can offer targeted small group instruction, re-teach core concepts, and provide additional resources.

Examples: Rubrics, Tests, Facilitation Grids, Individual Conferences/Oral Interviews, Student Folders, Notebook/Portfolio Check

This categorization allows teachers to make purposeful decisions about various assessments in order to produce results.

Proposed Services:

IDE Corp. will continue to work with the cadre of teachers from last year to extend their knowledge and application of formative assessment, including the relationship between formative assessment and the Common Core State Standards. Prior to the first day, an IDE Corp.



consultant will develop a *SurveyMonkey* data collection survey to identify what strategies and structures teachers are already using and their comfort level with each. Based on this data and formative assessment data gathered by the consultant throughout the initiative, each day will be custom-designed to meet the needs of the cadre of teachers. A consultant will be on site for a minimum of 7 days across the school year.

We recommend providing at least 7 full-day sessions with up to 20 participants (groups of 21 or larger may be accommodated by adding an assisting consultant). The sessions would be differentiated so that teachers from last year's sessions may continue to attend alongside teachers who are new to working with IDE Corp. Anticipated topics will include:

- · The difference between formative and summative assessment
- The difference in corrective actions teachers take upon receiving formative v. summative assessment
- The role of the teacher in the quest for student achievement
- The role of formative assessment in achieving the Common Core State Standards
- · Formative assessment as a tool for effective teaching
- · The four types of formative assessment
- Designing quality "temperature gauges"
- Adjusting instruction for the class and for individuals as a result of "temperature gauge" assessments
- Designing quality "breakpoint" assessments
- Adjusting instruction for the class and for individuals as a result of "breakpoint" assessments
- Designing quality "student directed assessments"
- Adjusting instruction for the class and for individuals as a result of "student directed assessments"
- Designing quality "comprehensive assessments"
- Adjusting instruction for the class and for individuals as a result of "comprehensive assessments"
- Using facilitation grids for monitoring concept and skill development

The IDE Corp. consultant will develop a *Google* site for all workshops that provides participants with activity lists, resources, and a schedule of the days' events.

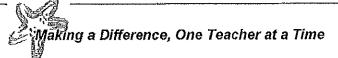
Fees:

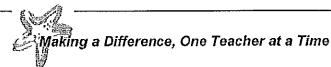

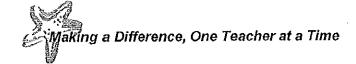

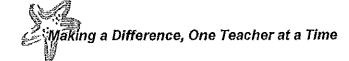
